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AMRIT BHAWAN, UTTARAKHAND

An Art Deco bungalow with a private Ganga ghat offers a serene, spiritual escape

he thing about beloved, sacred sites like Haridwar is that they can get so crowded with visitors that you end up missing the peace you came for. Enter Amrit Bhawan. Set right by the banks of the Ganga, in the quiet neighbourhood of Kankhal, it is close enough to the busy parts of the town to be convenient, but secluded enough that you get your quiet time.

Originally built in the 1970s as a second home for the Bajaj family, the Art Deco-style bungalow fell into disuse about 20 years ago. The family restored it and reopened it as a boutique hotel in 2020. In its new avatar, its old-world charm meets contemporary touches of luxury such as a rooftop hot tub and a private yoga deck. Heirloom furniture was upcycled by local artisans who incorporated craft and textile into a modern design language.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

Of the eight bright, airy guest rooms, four come with private balconies that look out to the river. In keeping with the original design aesthetic, all the bathrooms feature terrazzo interiors in calming hues like mint, peach, and ochre. If you can haul yourself out of the hot tub, you'll find a cosy library, a



riverside garden, a massage room, and a private ghat ideal for meditation or yoga. A highlight of the property is the interactive wall installation of khartals, traditional wooden instruments used in the Ganga Aarti.

The retreat does not serve meat, eggs, or alcohol, but you won't miss them, given the top-notch Garhwali fare on offer (don't miss the the Uttarakhand thali at the restaurant, starring millet and lentil-based dishes, and Haridwar's famous chaats),



which you can also learn how to cook. Outside the property, explore the city's architecture, mythology, and culinary heritage via curated walking tours and nature hikes. This is also a great base for adventure junkies, as the resort can organise white-water rafting in nearby Rishikesh.

ANOPURA JAIPUR, RAJASTHAN

This is a place that will remind you to stop and smell the flowers

Now living. That's the vibe at this charming boutique escape just outside Jaipur. Set on vast swathes of farmland, Anopura was set up by Jaipur local Aditya Baheti. who was inspired by his grandfather's farmhouse that he grew up on. Here, modern luxuries like private pools coexist with a more rustic aesthetic (think thatched roofs, charpoys for poolside daybeds), providing an experience that is as simple and old-school as it is sophisticated and luxurious. While there are things to do outside, like guided tours of the village, nature trails, and birding, we wouldn't blame you if you just wanted to spend your day milking cows at the resort's dairy farm, enjoying the meditative rhythms of a pottery class, or gazing at the Aravali hills as you float in the infinity pool.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

With just 14 suites and villas set on 60 acres, you're guaranteed privacy and solitude. And it helps that the

rooms are beautifully designed, with earthy stone floors, intricately carved wooden furniture, and linens featuring traditional Indian motifs. Some of the keys feature private pools and patios, while others have their own garden. Each suite has two bedrooms, spacious bathrooms, and big windows. What's also great is that this is a pet-friendly stay, although you're encouraged to keep your pet on a leash in the common areas.

At Farmstead, the restaurant, the farm-to-table menu spotlights Rajasthani classics like laal maas and gatte ki sabzi, alongside some North Indian and European favourites. Ask for your lunches to be served picnic-style and dinner to be served under the stars; for a special occasion, you could even do a private barbecue by the pool. And when you need to relax after all that relaxation, spend a few hours at the Ayurvedic spa where you'll get detox drinks, dosha-balancing massages, and Himalayan body scrubs.

BAREFOOT AT HAVELOCK, ANDAMAN & NICOBAR ISLANDS

When beach and rainforest meet, you get a little slice of paradise

ocated behind the idyllic Radhanagar Beach, Barefoot at Havelock sprawls across 25 acres of regenerated rainforest, making it a truly unique beachside jungle resort, where the ocean waves crash and froth seemingly in tandem with the jungle music courtesy birds, frogs, and insects. There are more than 50 species and subspecies of birds on site, including most of the 22 species endemic to the Andaman Islands. The resort is committed to a sustainable way of life and has undertaken many initiatives to this end. For example, there are no pathway lights so that resident endemic owls aren't disturbed, and there are no alien, exotic, or water-hungry plants on campus. Aside from rainwater harvesting, the team at Barefoot also composts organic and garden waste; food waste goes into the piggery, while organic compost, like refuse from livestock, is used in the garden. Barefoot also sponsors many sporting events in the village as well as the local primary school and community festival celebrations.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

The resort's 31 cottages and villas are built using natural, renewable materials like cane, thatch, and wood, the last of which is sourced from plantations with a certified replanting programme. The all-wood Andaman Villas are especially popular for their glass-topped showers





that offer views of the thick rainforest canopy. Spend your days witnessing the magic of the marine world with a snorkelling or scuba diving session, trekking to the famed Elephant Beach. or taking a guided walk through shallow rock pools and exploring the marine life within. You could also try your hand at traditional line fishing - and then get your catch cooked the way you like for your next meal. Speaking of food, the on-site restaurant, The Swimming Elephant makes an excellent prawn curry served in a coconut shell, and the cosy bar Dugong Dugon is a great place to pregame before a night walk through the forest and across the shore.

GETTING THERE

Fly to Sri Vijaya Puram (Port Blair) from most major Indian cities. From there, take a high-speed catamaran ferry to Havelock Island.

CHOSPA HOTEL, LADAKH

Cultural explorations with the chance of spotting a snow leopard are on offer here

he mountain region of Ladakh is known for its confluence not iust of the Indus and Zanskar rivers, but of a variety of cultures. With Tibet to the east, Kashmir to the west, and Central Asian influences in its past, thanks to Leh having been a trading post on the Silk Route, this is a region that unites many communities and traditions. Leh is famous for its centuries-old Buddhist monasteries. jewel-toned lakes, surreally barren landscapes, and imposing mountain peaks, and is a favourite with biking enthusiasts. It is also home to rare wild cats like the snow leopard, the Eurasian Ivnx and the Pallas's cat. And a stay at Chospa Hotel in Leh is a great way to experience all of this.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

The 17-key property offers an intimate exploration of Ladakhi culture, right from the get-go. The building, made using local materials of compressed earth, wood, and stone, features



architectural elements inspired by the old houses and palaces of the region. The use of compressed earth bricks in the walls keeps the rooms insulated from extreme temperatures, and the beds are made of locally sourced timber.

Spend your days exploring the old town of Leh, doing short hikes, or going on longer treks into different valleys. For the spiritually inclined, the hotel's travel desk can even arrange a session with a senior monk at one of Leh's famed monasteries. On your return, have a drink at the 0° North Bar and an al fresco meal at the Old Road Café, and enjoy a leisurely chat with Stanzin Gurmet, who runs the hotel as well as winter expeditions



to spot snow leopards and other local wildlife. The best part? It's a pet-friendly property, and offers special meals for your four-legged friends.

GETTING THERE

Fly direct to Leh from Delhi, Jammu, or Srinagar. From other major cities, there are flights with stopovers. The property is about 4km from the airport in Leh.

MELA KOTHI – THE CHAMBAL SAFARI LODGE, UTTAR PRADESH

History, wildlife, and ecotourism in one gorgeous old-school mansion

uilt in the 1860s as a camp office for the biannual cattle fair and a hunting lodge for visitors, the property fell into disrepair as farming became more mechanised and the fair lost its sheen. In 1999, the inheritors, IIT graduate Ram Pratap and his environment scientist wife, Anu. decided to restore the kothi and its surrounding land. The result is Mela Kothi – The Chambal Safari Lodge, an ecotourism project rooted in charming hospitality and sustainability. It is open from October to April every year; the rest of the time, the team focuses on conservation, protection, and antipoaching patrolling.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

About 60km from Agra, in the heart of the Chambal-Yamuna Doab, the kothi is set on 35 acres of regenerated forest. Its 14 rooms and cottages feature colourful, spacious interiors and soothing views of the landscape and woodland. The verandahs and courtyards, combined with a cosy library and lounge area, give the property a homely yet luxurious



feel. The grounds, dotted with water bodies and olive and lemon orchards, are home to more than 198 species of birds and small mammals such as palm civets, jungle hares, foxes, hedgehogs, and the Indian striped hyena, all of which can be spotted on a guided nature walk. The region surrounding the property is equally fascinating. Don't miss a boat safari on the Chambal river, home to gharials and the Gangetic river dolphin, or a visit to the village of Rapri, home to many medieval-era tombs and other monuments. Another highlight



is Bhareh, at the confluence of the Chambal and Yamuna rivers. A guided drive of about seven hours (with a packed lunch) will take you through a wild, forbidding landscape, across ravines, into the deepest hinterland, and give you the history of the area. Explore the ruins of the fortress of Bhareh, and a Shiva Temple with stunning views of the confluence and countryside.



KUMARAKOM LAKE RESORT, KERALA

This 25-acre idyll on the banks of Lake Vembanad will take away all your worries

elf care. That's what comes to mind when one enters Kumarakom Lake Resort. Those knots in your neck? You can feel them loosen as you take in the view of the quiet, green-framed backwaters that hug the resort. That tricky presentation that's at the top of your to-do list even when you're supposed to be on holiday? It will suddenly seem a lot less daunting when you walk around the exquisitely landscaped gardens or cruise down the backwaters in a houseboat or kayak. After all, this is the award-winning Kumarakom Lake Resort.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

The Kottayam resort is home to 65 beautifully appointed villas and rooms, all built in the traditional Kerala style. While some have their own pools and Jacuzzis, others offer private courtyards and views of the canals or the lake. A 250m pool meanders

across one side of the resort, adding a serene touch to the villas that flank it. You could even stay in one of the houseboats, which come with all the mod cons and your own personal assistants and chef.

Speaking of food, don't miss a meal at the multicuisine restaurant Ettukettu, housed in what was once the home of a noble family. You could



try the freshest catch cooked in authentic Kerala styles at Vembanad, the Seafood Bar. You can even take a cooking class with one of the property's expert chefs and learn the intricacies of local cuisine. In between all the eating, though, don't forget to take some time out for a session at Ayurmana, the Ayurvedic centre, or for a sunset cruise on the backwaters or a pottery class that's so soothing that it feels like meditation.

THE SERAI CHIKMAGALUR, KARNATAKA

A coffee-scented, lush green eye massage is what you'll get here

eep in Karnataka's Western Ghats lies the thickly forested region of Malenadu, home to the birthplace of coffee in India, Chikmagalur. And at The Serai Chikmagalur, coffee is at the centre of the holiday experience. Here, coffee is not about staying awake through a meeting that could have been an email. Here, coffee is about quiet contemplation, relaxation, and letting go.



HOTEL ESSENTIALS

Set on coffee and pepper plantations, the 29 villas here range from Estate Villas with outdoor showers to two-storey Estate Terraces, and The Residence, a plush two-bedroom cottage with dining and living spaces and its own garden. No matter which room type you choose, you're guaranteed blissful views of the lush landscape and your own private gazebo and pool.

Spend your day hiking up Karnataka's highest peak, Mullayyanagiri, walking through the plantation and learning the coffee-making process, enjoying a body scrub made of coffee at the spa, loosening those tight city muscles with a spot of aqua yoga, or cycling through the countryside. And when you return, enjoy an outdoor meal of traditional Malenadu recipes made with locally grown ingredients. You could even cook with the chefs and then sit down for a traditional banana leaf meal.

THE SERAI KABINI
& THE SERAI BANDIPUR,
KARNATAKA

A black panther, an elephant, and a tiger walk into a bar

o, they don't actually walk into a bar, but the beauty of a stay at **The Serai Kabini** or The Serai Bandipur is that you can spend your days checking out the animals' watering holes and in the evenings, enjoy a delicious, potent cocktail of your choice at your own outdoor watering hole. Set by the backwaters of the Kabini river that runs through the southern end of Nagarhole National Park, the former offers a paradisiacal combination of dense jungle and serene water outside and quiet luxury inside. And not too far away is the Bandipur Tiger Reserve, for which The Serai Bandipur is the ideal base.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

Dotted across The Serai Kabini's lush 10-acre expanse are 20 cosy cottages and villas, which offer views of the river, the jungle, the hills, and beyond. Some of them feature outdoor sitting areas. If you really want to take your



quiet luxury up a notch, book The Residence, a more secluded stay option that has two private verandahs, a living room, and its own Jacuzzi. Over at The Serai Bandipur, 24 luxurious stays await, offering stunning views of the Nilgiris. The Residence here features a terrace gazebo made of log and thatch.

At both places, you could opt for a morning or evening jungle safari (we'd recommend both) in Nagarhole or Bandipur, both part of the Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve. The area is home to elephants, tigers, deer, leopards, panthers, dholes, sloth bears, and a multitude of birds. Back at the retreats, board games like carrom and chess are yours for the playing, or you could gather your loved ones around a bonfire or watch a wildlife movie.



Feel like a local at this beautiful five-room villa



n the town of Muvattupuzha, a commercial centre for tea being transported to Kochi, near the Muvattupuzha river, lies Indian Summer House, an intimate fivebedroom villa surrounded by coconut groves and tropical gardens. Owners Mini and Don van de Pol worked hard to transform Mini's ancestral home into an eco-friendly oasis for discerning travellers. Tranquil walkways and organic gardens embrace the villa, which is set on reclaimed and rewilded land. The estate is dotted with ponds and outdoor sculptures, and houses a beautiful pool surrounded by coconut palms. An exploration of the grounds will also allow sightings of peacocks and many other birds.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

The villa spotlights the local colonial architecture of Kerala, with handcrafted timber ceilings and radiating rafters, and the space is designed keeping in mind the principles of Vastu. While all the rooms are beautifully designed and kitted out, with rainshowers, private patios, and garden views, the pièce de résistance is the Sita

Suite, with a private balcony, an opento-sky shower, a second room with twin beds, and a study. Of the five rooms, four are on the ground floor, and are easy for wheelchair users to access, as is the outdoor dining space. Small ramps are also in place to access the pool. You can book as many of the rooms as you need or even the entire villa.

authentic local cuisine, and here, you can go a step further. Go with the team on a market tour to shop for ingredients and then return to spend some time cooking your own evening meal with the inhouse chefs. If you don't want to do the work, just enjoy the food in an outdoor setting. The staff can also arrange a poolside dinner or barbecue upon request. Other experiences on offer here include toddy tapping and tasting, and visits to a forest temple, waterfall, and cave. With most of the staff being local, guests are invited to participate in cultural experiences like visiting a third-generation tea shop and even ceremonies at a family temple. There's also an Ayurvedic spa where you can get a guided consultation to help you choose your therapy.

THE ALAMPARA, TAMIL NADU

From watersports to historic forts, there's something for everyone at this glamping retreat

alt pans dotted with flamingos, the ruins of a historic 18th-century fort, serene lagoons, the thrill of overwater adventures – all of this is on offer in the coastal town of Maranakkam. Combine this with a stay in a luxurious tent, with only the sound of the backwaters lapping against the shore right outside, and you've figured out how to spell paradise.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

Hugged by water, The Alampara consists of four spacious tents, each designed to maximise those rustic vibes while also kitted out with every mod con you could want. A highlight is the freestanding bathtub with a view, so you can gaze at the green expanse outside your floor-to-ceiling glass doors. Pro tip: book the tent closest to the backwaters so you get not just a view but direct, private access to the waterfront. Among the common spaces, the lounge shack, an openair spot overlooking the backwaters, is ideal for your morning coffee or evening drink. You could also book the waterfront dining shack for a private meal for yourself or for two. At Nila, the



dining space, delve into South India's foodscape with a farm-to-table menu that uses many ingredients from the retreat's own gardens, such as in the fresh lemongrass ice cream.

The retreat offers a number of activities that will allow you to get to know the local region. From wakeboarding, windsurfing, and kayaking to meeting the mussel pickers of Maranakkam and joining them as they cast their nets into the water, from learning the history of the Alamparai Fort to seeing how salt is harvested, there's a lot on offer. A

highlight, if you can time it right, is witnessing baby Olive Ridley turtles making their way into the sea during hatching season.

LUXUNLOCK PRIVATE VILLA EXPERIENCES

A collection of treasured private homes in Southern India brought to you by a sustainable luxury brand that promotes the cultural, culinary, and ecological heritage of the region

uxUnlock is a luxury villa brand dedicated to providing not just private accommodation, but a comprehensive destination experience. At its heart, LuxUnlock is built on three core principles. One, the preservation of local heritage; two, the offering of immersive experiences by supporting local communities; and three, the creation of an enterprise that opens new destinations to the world and has a positive socio-economic impact on these regions. The five properties showcased here represent these core values.

An exemplar of the first tenet is **Maison Twenty-Six**, a 120-year-old garden villa in the French Quarter of **Puducherry**. The home's giant Franco-Tamil columns and teak pillars, and original Belgian floor tiles embody rustic charm, romance, and nostalgia, winning it the prestigious



Vieilles Maisons Francaises (VMF) award for the preservation of French architectural heritage. The pet-friendly stay has four bedrooms that can be booked together or individually.

Located by the **backwaters** of Kerala's Vembanad Lake. **Nakshathra Mana** is a celebration of the community and culture it is surrounded by. And food is a key aspect of this celebration. At the fourbedroom villa, there is no fixed menu. Offerings change daily, based on what is locally available, in season, and fresh from local vendors. Guests are simply asked about choice of protein and any dietary restrictions; the rest is left to consultant chef Abraham Jacob's kitchen crew, who could serve exquisite duck mappas one day and biryani the next.

Another stay that embodies the brand's second tenet is **Haiwatha**









By The Brook, a 150-year-old six-bedroom bungalow near Ooty that's rooted in nostalgia, with markers of the house's storied past on its walls, including the deed from 1918 when an English doctor bought it from the Princess of Lovedale, pictures of St Stephen's Church in Ooty from 1830, and advertisements for Afghan Snow, the legendary beauty cream brand founded by the owner's family. The property is closely associated with experts in ecology, anthropology, and artisanal produce.

Nestled in a 10-acre private forest in Kodaikanal, **Sunny Woodlands Estate** is a stunning 90-year-old villa. In its restored avatar, it features glass panelling, skylights, and large windows, which transformed this colonial **Kodaikanal** bungalow into a modern minimalist mansion that allows the wilderness outside to shine. The six bedrooms, across two connected units, can be booked individually or together. All rooms offer cantilevered outdoor decks so you can feast your eyes on the Palani Hills or the lush forest outside. In the overdeveloped, fragile



ecosystem of Kodaikanal, the estate is an attempt to preserve and rewild the forest around it through collaborations with local non-profits.

Set beside the Kabini Reservoir in Nagarhole Tiger Reserve, LuxUnlock's newest offering, Ira Kabini, is a four-bedroom safari villa just 90 minutes from Mysuru. It offers views of the tranquil backwaters, expansive lawns, and a heated infinity pool that merges with the lake. The fact that it's set slightly away from the cluster of resorts in the Karapur area eases the pressures on a major tourist hotspot in this area. Despite the obvious temptations of building a larger-scale wildlife lodge, LuxUnlock decided to convert an existing private home into a luxury wildlife experience with conservation at its heart.

The LuxUnlock experience goes beyond just a villa. It is about exploring a region in a way that will deepen one's understanding of it, and strengthen one's resolve to preserve what makes it special.

THE BLACKBUCK LODGE, GUJARAT

Rustic chic meets sleek modernity at this stunning property

bout 15 years ago, Mickey Desai, the owner of more than 150 acres of family land adjacent to Velavadar National Park, decided to turn it into a thriving grassland ecosystem. He was keen to spotlight the region's unique wildlife, which includes blackbucks, hyenas, wolves, jackals, foxes, and more than 300 species of resident and migratory birds. With nearly 85 per cent of the land earmarked for wilderness, he planted indigenous trees, shrubs, and grasses that have since grown into a forest. Although the park is closed from mid-June to mid-October, the lodge is open all year round and this off season is, in fact, a great time to enjoy the monsoon lushness as well as spot the endangered lesser florican and the Sarus crane.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

Each of the lodge's 14 villas includes a patio, indoor and outdoor bathrooms, and a deck looking out to the wild beauty of the bush. The interiors meld rustic charm and modern elegance – think stone walls adorned with stunning photos and illustrations of local wildlife, wooden logs as stands for bedside lamps, cushioned bay window seating, alongside high-speed wi-fi and top-of-the-line hairdryers in the bathrooms. Some of the villas also have a private plunge pool.

When you're done lazing, head out for a game drive in Velavadar National Park, explore the village and the pastoral settlements of the Bharvad community, known for their colourful clothes and chunky jewellery. You

could also enjoy sundowners by the river, or go birding in the bush. Back at the lodge, meals are experiences. For example, the bush dinner, which is your chance to enjoy local traditional dishes, expertly cooked, under the stars and surrounded by the grasslands and distant calls of jungle animals.



DEV SHREE DEOGARH, RAJASTHAN

This home away from home celebrates local crafts and craftspeople

nspired by the palaces and havelis of the Mewar region and Udaipur in particular. Shatruniai Singh Chundawat, the scion of the Deogarh family, built this property that looks like a palace, but feels like home. He was also clear that the space should celebrate local craftsmanship, and should teach young people of the region about hospitality. The result is this boutique resort. Dev Shree is located on a plateau in the Aravali hills right by the Ragho Sagar lake, which plays host to a vast number of local and migratory birds. The property is dotted with intricately carved pillars, large gardens, and a gorgeous pool surrounded by palm trees. And the Deogarh family lives on the estate, so you'll have many opportunities to chat with them and hear their stories and the history of the region.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

The 10 suites are bright and airy, with

old-school arches, many windows, and plenty of sitting and lounging space. Seven of the keys, plus the dining room and several common areas, are on the ground level and easy for wheelchair users to access. A major plus point is that pets are allowed and the hotel will provide food for them. There are four dogs already living on site, so make sure your furry companion is comfortable with that.

This is the kind of place where you could go for a solo trip or book out all the rooms for a holiday with the extended family or even for a small party for a day. Its central location also makes it ideal for a break during a road trip across Rajasthan. Spend your days on nature walks, cycling, hiking up a hill, enjoying picnic lunches at the estate farms or a packed high tea beside the lake. Back at the resort, dig into traditional Indian fare made using family recipes that have been passed down through generations.

Where cats and culture coexist in harmony

National Park, the last remaining natural habitat of the Asiatic lion, lies this exquisite resort, where Gujarati traditions have been lovingly reimagined to create a modern, luxe safari retreat. Between October and March is an excellent time to visit, when the weather is cool and dry, so you can make the most of being outdoors. Aside from lion sightings, this is a good base to visit iconic cultural sites such as Somnath Temple and Junagadh.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

Inspired by traditional Gujarati pol houses, the property has 18 kothis set around a central haveli, which serves as the heart of the retreat. Each villa spans two levels, with the master bedroom above to capture forest views, incorporating distinctive elements like raised plinths, courtyards, and jharokhas. The interiors feature Kutchi lipan



plasterwork with delicate mirror work and geometric patterns, as well as hand-carved wooden furniture and accents, vintage appliqué cushions, and handwoven textiles. Common spaces include a library, pool, edible garden, and spa.

Freshly baked breads, granola, and Gujarati delicacies are on offer for breakfast, alongside, live stations for eggs, dosas, and traditional parathas. The farm-to-table ethos is seen in signature offerings like the house-blend botanical tea and the raw mango chutney made from fruit grown on site. Children can enjoy their own specially crafted menu, but even they shouldn't miss the chance to have a proper Kathiawadi-style dinner in the mango orchard.



The main draw, of course, is the big cat, which you can spot on safari drives guided by superb naturalists. Little ones might enjoy the Junior Naturalist Program, where they can engage in interactive learning about wildlife. Kids and adults can both participate in tree plantation drives.

JIM'S JUNGLE RETREAT, UTTARAKHAND

More than a luxury lodge, this exquisite retreat offers guests a chance to forge a relationship with the jungle

conservation effort that also embodies luxury hospitality, the retreat is rooted in the idea that humans and nature can and must coexist, and that understanding one's relationship with the natural world is the key to enjoying it and saving it. Conservationist and co-founder Daleep Akoi has had a lifelong connection with Corbett Tiger Reserve, since he was first taken there as a two year old by his father, who himself first visited the wildlife haven when he was five. That deep connection with the forest honed his conservation instincts, and eventually, the family bought and rewilded the land on which the lodge rests, leading to a number of birds, insects, and small mammals visiting the estate. 'Seek the tiger, find the jungle' is not just the retreat's tagline, but its underlying ethos, because while you may arrive only to see the big cat, you will leave having discovered many more wonders of the jungle, as well as your own self and your place in the ecosystem. Here, a seemingly mundane



excursion to see termites at work can turn into as thrilling an adventure as spotting a tiger. And that is the magic of this retreat.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

Set by the buffer zone of Corbett Tiger Reserve and 2km from the Dhela safari zone entry gate, the retreat has 18 residences, which feature wraparound verandahs, spacious bathrooms, and plush furnishings. The glass walls in the jungle bungalows offer panoramic forest views as well as a walk-in wardrobe and a sunroom. The family cottages are wheelchair-friendly and there are electric buggies to take guests around the property.

While safaris might be the main event, the retreat offers many other seasonal experiences. You could go on a guided walk across the property, where you'll spot scores of bird species, langurs, or even an enormous python near a pool of water. You could explore spider trails, visit Dhela village, explore

the region on two wheels, or settle in for a wildlife film screening. In the lazy hours of the afternoon, have a leisurely dip in the swimming pool or pick one of the many cosy nooks across the retreat as your reading spot for the day. You could even ask for your evening tea or meals to be set up in one of the machans so you get a bird's-eye view of the jungle at different times of day. And with 10 deeply knowledgeable resident naturalists, your evening conversation is bound to be an experience in itself.

GOGUNDA PALACE, RAJASTHAN

A slice of history with a side of luxury

et in the Aravali hills, this former fort was built as a centre of war strategy in the 16th century. This was where Maharana Udai Singh II escaped to after his defeat in battle against Mughal emperor Akbar, where he died, and where his son, Maharana Pratap Singh's coronation took place. The new ruler of Mewar made Gogunda the capital of the kingdom, which it remained until the city of Udaipur was built.

Today, Gogunda Palace is a tranquil yet colourful oasis of Rajput customs and hospitality. You'll see many examples of classic Mewari architecture, such as chattris, cupolas, arched doors and windows, carved pillars, and jharokhas. The charbagh, a garden with a central marble fountain and four-course waterways, is lush with champa and neem trees, and pink bougainvillea.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

The palace hotel's 40 rooms and suites are stunning examples of craft and history, down to the smallest details. Some rooms come with carved marble trays in the bathrooms and traditional handi lamps in the rooms,

others feature arched alcoves niched into the walls with coloured glass that lends a vibrant quality to the sunlight that streams in. One of the suites has a wall entirely decked out in mirrors, while others features original Rajput miniature paintings, Shekhawati murals, and marble latticework. The Raj Tilak suite, the site of Maharana Pratap's coronation, is embellished with gold-leaf painting on the walls and ceiling.

Outside the hotel, visit Myrah ki Gufah, a set of caves where Maharana Pratap used to hide his weapons. A two-hour drive away is the Jawai leopard sanctuary, where you can spend the afternoon and return in





time for dinner. At the on-site Heritage Quarter, enjoy traditional dishes like laal maas and dal Mewari. The poolside Bouganvillea Bar has an excellent selection of wines and spirits.

Owned by Amit Sankhala, the grandson of legendary tiger conservationist Kailash Sankhala, the first director of Project Tiger, the estate is an embodiment of the family's decadeslong commitment to the protection of India's wealth of flora and fauna, and to creating an ecosystem that benefits the local community. Situated right by the buffer zone of Pench Tiger Reserve, the retreat has been a source of employment for many locals, and supports schools in the area to educate children on the importance of earth-friendly living.

HOTEL ESSENTIALS

The property is home to 10 beautifully appointed tents designed to provide



unobstructed views. They also feature a lovely patio from where you can see the forest and the seasonal stream as you sip your morning coffee or tea. No trees were felled for the wooden floors or furniture: instead you'll see repurposed wood from ship decks and vintage furniture from the Supreme Court of India and embassies in Delhi. Guests can enjoy the plunge pool, the collection of wildlife books in the lounge, and sundowners or a bonfire by the huge banvan tree around which the property is centred. Pench, with its dry deciduous teak forests, is a stunning landscape to drive through, whether you see a big cat or not. You could even opt for a night safari, which will give you a completely different glimpse into the secrets of the jungle. You could also go on a guided walk in

the forest or visit the village and the schools supported by the camp to gain a deeper understanding of local life.

One thing you shouldn't miss is a night spent sleeping outdoors on a Star Bed. Set on a raised platform, it will give you the chance to see the forest under a blanket of stars, listening to the music of crickets, owls, frogs, and jackals, with the alarm calls of deer the only sign that a predator is on the move. This is the circle of life at its most primal, and it is a privilege to witness the magic unfold.




back and float in the pool. No one could blame you.

With no traditional restaurant, guests can enjoy a variety of unique dining experiences, such as breakfast at a sitout with river views and a thali dinner starring regional delicacies by the pool. Of the resort's eight keys, four are housed in the main villa, each looking out across the infinity pool and gardens to the sea beyond. The King Suite, on the first floor, comes with a 20m glass wall that opens out to a private balcony, offering jaw-dropping views



of the Aghanashini river delta and the sea. Situated a little away from the main villa and accessed by a private path through the gardens is the Queen Suite, which features striking columns, Mughal-esque vaulted ceiling, and an in-room bathtub carved from a single piece of white marble. Two of the rooms are wheelchair-accessible, and there are golf buggies to explore the estate that's home to peacocks and langurs, a full-size tennis court, and a state-of-the-art home cinema that houses a library of classics.



The food is a highlight, with the freshest tiger prawns, mud crabs, king fish, snapper, pomfret, squid, and more making their way to the kitchen. Greenlipped mussels and wild oysters from the Aghanashini estuary also find place on the day's menu frequently. In addition, the on-site gardens provide fruit, veggies, herbs, and spices. Make sure you book a candlelit stepwell dinner one night, so you can enjoy the freshest grilled seafood under the stars, surrounded by a thousand candles, with local musicians playing the flute and tabla just for you.
